Can I Change My Name in IL if I Have a Criminal Record?



You cannot change your name in IL if:

- You have a felony conviction within the past 10 years. **Note that 10 years must have passed since the completion of your full sentence, including parole or probation.
- You have to comply with the sex offender registry.
- You have a conviction for identity theft or aggravated identity theft.

HOWEVER, there are a few exceptions:

- Your conviction(s) was pardoned
- Certain Class 4 felony cannabis convictions under the Cannabis Control Act

Regardless of your criminal record, you can change your gender marker:

- Changing gender marker on your
 Driver's License: Complete this Gender
 Designation Change form(1) and bring it to your nearest Secretary of State facility(2) with your current license. Right now IL only allows M or F as gender markers on your driver's license, but in 2024 they will start allowing X as an option for non-binary individuals.
- Changing gender marker on your Birth
 Certificate: After updating your license,
 you can change your gender marker on
 your birth certificate by completing this
 form(3). *Note that the second page must
 be filled out by a medical or mental health
 professional. You may select "N" as your
 preferred gender marker on your birth
 certificate if you identify as non-binary.
